THE ASSOCIATION'S LAUNCH EVENT

A welcome by the Ambassador, as keynote speaker Minister of Finance of the Grand-Duchy of Luxembourg Luc Frieden, a talk by Frank Boas himself – after all the one man who connects us all – and a walking dinner reception: In short, the perfect recipe for an unforgettable evening.

Of course, no Harvard Boas Alumni event without at least a bit of intellectual challenge. The academic session took off with a much-appreciated speech by **ambassador Gutman** himself. He emphasized the importance of the Boas grants for increasing mutual understanding.



Boas alumnus **Stanislas Adam** continued with pointing out some of the challenges the association faces, and which were discussed at the board meeting preceding the event:

Minister of Finance of the Grand-Duchy of Luxembourg and Boas alumnus **Luc Frieden**, the main guest speaker, addressed the current challenges the Eurozone faces. As he pointed out, a common currency itself is not enough for a strong Eurozone. "The Euro is something you carry in your pocket," Minister Frieden stated. "As a unifying factor that is a start, but there is more than that. Europe should be in our hearts. Only then there will be a strong, healthy and unified Europe."



Fulbright Executive Director Erica Lutes then had some bad and some good news. Although he planned to, **Frank Boas** could not make it to the event himself due to illness. Nevertheless, he managed to send us a touching video recording. It was clear he had not forgotten about us. The attendance of almost 40 alumni at this first event shows we have not forgotten about him either!



However, more is needed to truly revive and keep alive the family spirit and to attract the best new Boas fellows. Alumnus **Marc De Vos** explained how we could achieve this goal. He emphasized that a new, attractive, and interactive website is a strong tool. It will be the first challenge for the alumni association.

The evening ended with a walking dinner and a reception. All the alumni and Fulbright invitees were now able to catch up after, for some of them, many, many years. At the same time they were being interviewed on video as a small surprise for Frank Boas, to thank him for all he has done for us.

Seeing all those generations of Boas fellows together was absolutely encouraging, and we hope all those present enjoyed it too.
